Sermon Summary

We see in Luke 9:10-17 that the compassion of Christ not only cares for us but also calls us to care for others. When the disciples were interrupted by the crowd, Jesus saw an opportunity to serve and care for them. Just as Jesus had served and cared for the disciples, He now calls them to compassionately care for and meet the needs of the crowd.

Discussion Guide

- As you look at your daily routine, what opportunities do you have to serve others?
- Like the disciples, where do you struggle to see ministry opportunity as an interruption?
- How does it move you to know that your needs are never an interruption to Christ?
- Where does the compassion of Christ need to make you more compassionate?
- Where is the compassion of Christ calling you to serve this week?
