PLEASE CAREFULLY READ ALL THE NOTES BELOW:

***Attendees at All Worship Services or Other Gatherings** - (based upon CDC Guidelines) - All individuals that have a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher; or feel ill; or are experiencing fever, cough, shortness of breath, body aches, chills, or loss of taste or smell; or have tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 30 days; or are awaiting results from a COVID-19 test; or have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, or is suspected of having COVID-19, or has symptoms associated with COVID-19, should stay home and not attend a worship service or any other gathering.

****Social Distancing** (based upon CDC, White House and Alabama Health Dept. Guidance) - Limiting contact with others is the best way to avoid spreading the virus. People of different households must maintain at least six feet of distance from other people or households while sitting, standing, or walking within the church facility. This will require that shaking hands, hugging or any other forms of physical contact with members of different households is prohibited in an effort to avoid spreading the virus among attendees.

*****Vulnerable Populations** (based upon CDC Guidelines) - People 65 year of age and older; people who live in a nursing homes or long-term care facilities; people of all ages with underlying medical conditions, particularly if not well controlled, including: chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma, serious heart conditions, immunocompromised, severe obesity, diabetes, chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis, and liver disease.

******Face Masks Required for All Attendees** (based upon CDC and Alabama Health Dept. Guidance) - Masks prevent the person wearing the mask from spreading respiratory droplets to others when talking, singing, sneezing, or coughing. If everyone wears a mask during a worship service, the risk of exposure to COVID-19 can be reduced for everyone in attendance. Because people can spread the virus before symptoms start, or even if people never have symptoms, wearing a mask can protect others around you.
