# ROBBY HEAR METHOD ON THE HEAR METHOD

My wife, Kandi, and I developed, along with the help of our Replicate team, a reading plan called Foundations 260. The F-260 is a 260-day reading plan that highlights the foundational passages of Scripture every disciple should know. After failed attempts of reading through the Bible in a year with previous discipleship groups, I wanted a manageable plan that believers who had never read the Bible before could complete. In order to digest more of the Word, the F-260 encourages believers to read less and to keep a H.E.A.R. journal.

The acronym H.E.A.R. stands for Highlight, Explain, Apply, and Respond. Each of these four steps contributes to creating an atmosphere to hear God speak. After settling on a reading plan and establishing a time for studying God's Word, you will be ready to H.E.A.R. from God.

Notice that all of the words in the H.E.A.R. formula are action words: Highlight, Explain, Apply, and Respond. God does not want us to sit back and wait for Him to drop some truth into our laps. Instead of waiting passively, God desires that we actively pursue Him.

#### **MEMORIZING SCRIPTURE**

While many plans for memorizing Scripture are effective, a simple system has been effective for me. All you need is a pack of index cards and a committed desire to memorize God's Word. It's easy: write the reference of the verse on one side of the card and the text of the verse on the other. Focus on five verses at a time, and carry your pack of Scripture cards with you.

Throughout the day, whenever you have a few minutes, pull out your pack of Scripture cards and review them. Read the reference first, followed by the verse. Continue to recite the verse until you get a feel for the flow of the passage. When you are comfortable with the text, look only at the reference side of the card in order to test your recall.

#### **NOW ... FOUNDATIONS FOR KIDS!**

We believe that discipleship starts at home. It was always a dream that as parents went through *Foundations*, they could lead their kids through a similar resource. Now you have it — *Foundations for Kids*! Together you will go through the HEAR method this way:

Each day, has a passage for younger kids to read and a passage for older kids to read, plus the memory verse for the week. Each day kids will have the opportunity to read and memorize Scripture.

Each day, will have 4 bullets: 3 bullets are shorter and can be read by all kids. The 4th bullet will be longer for older kids. The fourth bullet may give additional information from extra verses or be written to an older kids level.

Every day, kids will have a learning activity to help them apply the Bible truth through a game, question, or puzzle.

**RESPOND** Kids will have the opportunity to respond in prayer.

#### **PARENTS**

Parents, help your kids go through the HEAR method each day. Younger Kids may need you to read for them and lead them through each day's devotion. Beginning readers will grow stronger each day and may only need occasional help. Middle and older kids will be able to read on their own each day. Regardless of your child's age, spend time discussing the day's reading and how he or she can apply God's truth to everyday life.

#### **BEST TIPS**

WHEN: Set a regular time for your time together with God.

**WHERE:** Find a comfortable, quiet place where you won't be disturbed.

**WHY:** Communicate with your kids that God wants to have a relationship with them. God speaks through the Bible, when you pray, and through fellowship with others — all ways your kids can hear God speak as you go through *Foundations for Kids*.

WHAT: Gather your Bible, Foundations for Kids, and a pencil or markers.

HOW: Explain how important the Bible is. Teach Bible skills as you go. Follow these steps:

- 1. Pray and ask God to be with your time together and to speak to you. Pray that you will listen and learn.
- 2. Read the passage from the Bible.
- 3. Ask your kids what they think the passage means. Read together through Explain and talk about the passage and what it means.
- 4. Complete the Application activity together.
- 5. Review the memory verse for the week. Create a verse card to review and practice learning.
- 6. Pray together.
- Hug your kids, tell them how much you love them, and tell them how thankful you are that you could spend this time together with God.


#### EXPLAIN

I don't think I like that animal, maybe I'll try again." He made everything perfectly to bring Him glory. Draw a picture of something from God's creation.





**PRAY:** Jesus, thank You for creating everything. I want to bring You glory in everything I do.

#### EXPLAIN

- Adam and Eve chose to break God's law. Our actions when we break God's law are called sins.
- Because Adam and Eve chose to sin, we are all sinners.
- Sin separates us from God because He is holy. God sent His Son Jesus to rescue us from sin.
- Adam and Eve were the first people God created, and they were also the first ones to sin. Because they brought sin into the world, everyone is born with sin. God sent Jesus to live a sinless life so that He could rescue us from sin.






#### EXPLAIN

- The world became so full of sin that God wanted to destroy it. Because Noah followed God, God did not punish Noah and his family.
- God is serious about sin and will not let it go unpunished.
- God gave Noah instructions to build the ark that saved his family and the animals from the flood.
- The world was so sinful, it made God very sad. Noah was the only person who followed God. God decided to destroy all life on the earth except for Noah's family and the animals that He would send to the ark.



Because Noah followed God, God gave Noah's family a rescue plan—the ark. Noah obeyed God, and his family was saved from the flood. God's ultimate rescue plan for us was His Son Jesus, who lived a sinless life but took the punishment for our sin anyway. 


#### EXPLAIN

- God made a promise to Noah that He would never flood the entire earth again.
- God made a rainbow as a reminder of His promise.
- God always keeps His promises.
- God made a promise never to destroy the earth with a flood again. To confirm His promise, God presented a rainbow.



Has someone ever broken a promise they made you? Every time we see a rainbow, we can remember God's promise and how God always keeps His promises. As you color the rainbow, think about some of God's promises to us.





**PRAY:** God, thank You for always keeping Your promises. Thank You also for rainbows, which are reminders of Your promise to Noah.





**OLDER KIDS:** Job 1:6-12,22 **YOUNGER KIDS:** Job 1:8-12,22 **MEMORY VERSE:** Genesis 1:27



#### EXPLAIN

- Satan thought Job followed God only because God protected Job from suffering.
- God allowed Satan to destroy Job's belongings and harm his family.
- Sometimes God allows suffering, even when it is not caused by sin.
- Satan thought if he made Job suffer, Job would sin or blame God. But Job didn't sin or blame God for his suffering.



Has someone ever been mean to you for no reason? We do not always understand why bad things happen, but bad things are not always the consequences of sin. Talk with a parent about why we should obey God all the time. Discuss the following questions:



- Why do we obey God?
- What does the story of Job teach us?
- Is it easier or harder to obey God when things are going well?
- Is it easier or harder to obey God when things are going poorly?
- How can we choose to love and obey God no matter how we feel?



**PRAY:** Heavenly Father, help me not to sin when I go through times of suffering.





OLDER KIDS: Job 38:1-7 YOUNGER KIDS: Job 38:1-4 MEMORY VERSE: Hebrews 11:8



#### EXPLAIN

- Job was feeling sorry for himself and asked God why he was suffering. God answered him.
- God reminded Job that He is the One who created the earth.
- God continues this chapter by reminding Job that He created everything and knows everything.
- Have you ever been surprised? God can't be surprised! Nothing happens that God doesn't know about. Because God created everything, He is in control of everything!



Sometimes we need to be reminded that even when we don't understand what is going on, God is in control of everything. Write down or draw a picture of a time you were surprised or didn't understand what was going on. Did God know what was happening? (Yes!)



## RESPOND

PRAY: God, thank You for being in control of everything. Help me remember You are in control even when I'm surprised or don't understand.




#### EXPLAIN

- Job remembered God can do anything, and nothing can get in the way of His plans.
- Job saw for himself God's grace and repented from his bad attitude toward suffering.
- God restored Job and blessed him with more than he had before.
- Have you ever felt like you were suffering and no one understood? Job felt that
  way, too. But after God finished talking, Job remembered God could do anything,
  and nothing can get in the way of His plans. Job understood God had been in
  control the whole time!



After Job repented, God gave Job twice as many things as he had before and restored his family. Solve the puzzle to discover what Job remembered.





**PRAY:** God, thank You for being in control even when we suffer! Help me to remember that You are in charge and nothing can get in the way of Your plans.





#### EXPLAIN

- God told Abram to take his family, leave his home, and go to a new place.
- God made a promise to Abram: if Abram followed God, then He would make Abram's name great and bless all the people of the world through him.
- Abram had faith in God, so he followed God's instructions.
- Have your parents ever taken you on a surprise trip or vacation? You didn't know where you were going until you got there, but your parents knew the whole time. Abram's trip was like that— God knew where Abram was going, even though he didn't. Abram had faith that God knew the destination.





#### APPLY

Abram followed God, even when he wasn't sure where he would end up. Imagine what it might feel like to leave home without being sure of where you would end up. Work through the maze to see how Abram might have felt as he followed God's instructions to leave his home.

**PRAY:** God, thank You for giving me instructions on how to follow You. Help me have faith as I follow Your instructions.




#### EXPLAIN

- God promised that Abram's family would grow into a great nation, but Abram didn't understand how this could happen because he didn't have any kids.
- God showed Abram the stars in the sky and said that he would have as many offspring as there were stars.
- Abram believed God and had faith, or trusted, He would do what He said.
- God showed Abram the stars and said that he would have as many offspring as the stars in the sky. Because Abram had faith in God, he believed Him, even though he and his wife Sarai were old and didn't have kids yet.



Have you ever tried to count the stars? There are too many for us to count! Even though we can't count the stars, God can. Draw what you think the sky might have looked like the night God showed Abram the stars.





**PRAY:** Heavenly Father, thank You for knowing the number of stars there are in the sky. Help me to have faith like Abram did, even when I don't understand Your plan.





#### EXPLAIN

- God made a covenant (special promise) with Abram to make him the father of many nations.
- As part of His covenant, God changed Abram's name to Abraham.
- God's covenant was not just for Abraham, but for his future children, too.
- A *covenant* is a promise between two people or between a person and God. Through Jesus, God made a covenant to rescue us from sin. We can trust in God to keep His promises.







OLDER KIDS: Genesis 18:9-15
YOUNGER KIDS: Genesis 18:13-14
MEMORY VERSE: Romans 4:20



#### EXPLAIN

- The Lord visited Abraham and Sarah at the tent where they lived.
- The Lord said He would visit them again in one year and by that time, Sarah would have a baby.
- Sarah wondered if she was too old to have a baby, even though God had already promised she would.
- God had made a promise to multiply Abraham's family, even when he and Sarah didn't have any kids. When Sarah heard the Lord say she would have a baby boy, she laughed because she was old. But the Lord reminded Abraham and Sarah that nothing is impossible or too hard for God.



God created everything, knows everything, and is in charge of everything. Look at the pictures and write the first letter of each word in the blank above to discover what is impossible for God.

#### EXPLAIN

- Just as God promised, Sarah gave birth to a baby boy.
- Abraham named their son Isaac.
- The name *Isaac* means "he laughs."
- God kept His promise and gave Abraham and Sarah a son. They named him Isaac. Abraham and Sarah were very old when Isaac was born and did not think it was possible to have a baby so late in life. But we know God keeps His promises and nothing is too hard for Him!



Yesterday, we learned that Sarah laughed when God said she would have a baby. Today, we hear how God fulfilled His promise! God is always faithful to keep His promises, even when we forget or lack faith. God's promises do not change, even when we sin. Which elephant's trunk is reaching toward a *true* statement?





PRAY: God, thank You for always keeping Your promises.





**OLDER KIDS:** Genesis 22:1-2,9-12 **YOUNGER KIDS:** Genesis 22:9-12 **MEMORY VERSE:** Romans 4:20



#### EXPLAIN


- God tested Abraham by asking him to sacrifice (give as an offering) his son Isaac.
- Isaac showed he was willing to do what his father said.
- God stopped Abraham before Isaac was hurt. God gave Abraham a ram to sacrifice instead of Isaac.
- Abraham must have had a hard time understanding why God would ask him to sacrifice his son, Isaac. Ultimately, God provided a ram for Abraham to sacrifice, and Isaac was rescued.

# APPLY

God sent Jesus to be the perfect sacrifice for our sin. Because of Jesus, we are rescued from sin just like Isaac was rescued because of the ram. Color the picture of the ram.




#### EXPLAIN

- Abraham sent a servant to find a wife for Isaac.
- The servant prayed for God to show him the woman that would be Isaac's wife.
- Rebekah was the woman God chose to be Isaac's wife.
- Abraham sent a servant back to his homeland to find a wife for Isaac. The servant had to trust God to show him the woman He had chosen for Isaac. He prayed that God would show her to him through her kindness. Rebekah was the woman God had chosen to become Isaac's wife.



Part of God's promise to make Abraham a great nation was that Isaac must have a wife. God had already planned for Rebekah to become Isaac's wife. God is always working to fulfill His promises. Circle the shadow that perfectly matches Rebekah.

**OLDER KIDS:** Genesis 25:27-34 **YOUNGER KIDS:** Genesis 25:29-34 **MEMORY VERSE:** Romans 4:20



#### EXPLAIN

- Isaac and Rebekah had twin sons, Esau and Jacob.
- Esau and Jacob were members of Abraham's family, so they were part of God's promise that Abraham would become a great nation.
- Esau sold his birthright to Jacob, which meant that the blessings (special gifts) meant for Esau went to Jacob.
- Esau and Jacob fought with each other from birth. Jacob wanted Esau's birthright (a special blessing from their father) and found a way to get Esau to sell it to him.



Jacob wanted something that didn't belong to him and sneakily found a way to get it. Jesus freely shared his birthright and special blessings with us when He paid the price for our sins on the cross. With a parent, discuss why a gift freely given to you is better than something you got by being sneaky.





**PRAY:** Jesus, thank You for sharing Your birthright and blessings with us by paying the price for our sin on the cross.





OLDER KIDS: Genesis 28:10-15 YOUNGER KIDS: Genesis 28:13-15 MEMORY VERSE: 1 John 3:18




#### EXPLAIN

- Jacob ran away because Esau was angry. Jacob had tricked his father, Isaac, into giving him the family blessing instead of Esau.
- God's promise to Abraham and Isaac was for Jacob as well, and God reminded Jacob of this promise in a dream.
- Even after Jacob sinned, God was still working toward keeping His promise.
- Jacob had been sneaky in getting Esau to sell his birthright, and then he tricked their father Isaac into giving him the family blessing instead of Esau. Esau was angry and wanted to kill Jacob. Even while the two brothers were fighting, God was working to keep His promise to Esau and Jacob.



Even though Jacob sinned and had to run away, God's promise did not change. God did not leave Jacob and reminded him that his offspring would be as plentiful as the dust of the earth, and all people would be blessed through him. Use the table on the right to decode the second half of this message.

#### EXPLAIN

- Jacob loved Rachel and wanted to marry her, but Laban tricked him into marrying Leah instead.
- Jacob agreed to work for Laban seven more years so he could marry Rachel.
- Jacob had tricked his own brother and father, and then he himself was tricked.
- Jacob had been a deceiver among his own family. Now Laban tricked Jacob.
   God was still working on Jacob's heart to bring Jacob back to Him.



While Jacob and Laban were tricking people, God was still working on His promise. God can use us even after we sin because He has the power to change our hearts and our attitudes. Discuss: What is something God can help you change your attitude about?



**PRAY:** God, thank You for having the power to change my heart and attitude.





OLDER KIDS: Genesis 32:24-30 YOUNGER KIDS: Genesis 32:24-28 MEMORY VERSE: 1 John 3:18




#### EXPLAIN

- For the first time since he ran away, Jacob was on his way to meet Esau.
- God came and wrestled with Jacob all night long. Jacob wouldn't let go until the man blessed him.
- God blessed Jacob and gave him a new name, Israel.
- Jacob was taking his family to meet Esau, and during the night, God came to wrestle with him. Jacob was unwilling to let the man go unless He blessed him.
   The blessing that the man gave to Jacob was a new name—Israel. Israel became the name of God's chosen people.



God changed Jacob's name, which became the name of the entire nation of God's people. When we become part of God's family, we receive a new name, too. We are called the children of God. To discover Jacob's new name, begin with the "I" in the center and follow the directions below, writing each new letter in the box.


#### APPLY

- Joseph's brothers sold him as a slave to traders who were on their way to Egypt.
- Joseph was his father's favorite son, which made his older brothers angry. They

didn't like that he was given special treatment. So one day, when Joseph went to them out in the field, they took away his special robe and eventually sold him. They never wanted to see him again.




#### APPLY





#### EXPLAIN

- The warden put Joseph in charge of all the prisoners.
- Joseph had been a slave in Potiphar's house for a while, and he had served his
  master well. Joseph also followed God. Potiphar's wife told a lie about Joseph,
  and Joseph was sent to prison. God did not leave Joseph just because he was in
  prison. Joseph was faithful to God, and God blessed Joseph even in prison. The
  warden put Joseph in charge of all the prisoners.

#### EXPLAIN

- God gave Joseph the power to tell two of Pharaoh's workers what their dreams meant while they were in prison together.
- When Pharaoh had bad dreams, one of the workers remembered Joseph, so Pharaoh called Joseph to the palace to tell him what his dreams meant.
- God gave Joseph the power to tell Pharaoh what his dreams meant. Pharaoh saw how wise God had made Joseph, and he put Joseph in charge of the entire nation of Egypt.
- Joseph continued to follow God while he was in prison. He told some of Pharaoh's workers what their dreams meant. After the workers went back to the palace, Pharaoh had bad dreams. One of the workers remembered Joseph. God gave Joseph the power to tell Pharaoh what his dreams meant. Pharaoh saw how wise Joseph was and put him in charge of the entire nation of Egypt.





#### EXPLAIN

- The dreams Joseph interpreted for Pharaoh foretold a famine, and Joseph prepared by storing food so that the people of Egypt would have something to eat.
- Joseph's brothers came to Egypt to buy food.
- Joseph's brothers didn't recognize him, but Joseph knew who they were. He didn't want them to know who he was yet.
- Pharaoh's bad dreams had predicted a famine—a time when food would be hard
  to find. When Pharaoh put Joseph in charge, he prepared by storing food. Joseph's
  family needed food, so they went to Egypt to purchase grain. Joseph recognized
  his brothers, but they did not recognize Joseph. He didn't want them to know who
  he was just yet.



Joseph had been through lots of hard times, but God had used them to place Joseph where he could help lots of people. Joseph followed God when good things and bad things happened. By following God, Joseph would have a chance to see his family again. Help three of Joseph's brothers find their way to the healthy grain.

#### EXPLAIN

- Joseph told his brothers who he was, and they were afraid he was angry with them.
- Joseph told his brothers not to be afraid. He was not angry, and he had forgiven them.
- Joseph told his brothers that God had planned for him to be in Egypt so he could help save his own family and other people when there wasn't anything to eat.
- Joseph finally told his brothers who he was. They were afraid Joseph would be angry with them because they had sold him as a slave. Joseph wasn't angry—he had forgiven them. Joseph realized it was God's plan for him to be in Egypt. God had placed Joseph in a position to help save not only the people of Egypt, but also his own family.



Joseph showed forgiveness and compassion to his brothers. God shows us forgiveness and compassion through Jesus. Even though we have sinned, God loves us and made a way for us to be forgiven through Jesus. Discuss: Have you ever forgiven someone for something they did to you? Was it easy or hard?

to put his brothers in charge of Pharaoh's animals.


## EXPLAIN

- The people wanted Jesus to be crucified even though He had done nothing wrong. They had Pilate release a guilty criminal, Barabbas, instead of Jesus.
- Pilate's soldiers beat Jesus, made fun of Him, and placed a crown of thorns on His head.
- Jesus was betrayed by Judas, one of His own disciples. The governor, Pilate, released
  a violent criminal named Barabbas instead of Jesus, and the people called for Jesus
  to be killed. Jesus endured horrible torture at the hands of His captors, but He never
  complained, sinned, or asked God to stop His death. God's plan was for Jesus to
  sacrifice Himself so that we, as sinners, could be saved.

## CHURCH TEACHING PLAN

Use this teaching plan if your church wants a weekly kids' small group focused on *Foundations for Kids*. You can group all of your kids together or divide into Younger Kids and Older Kids. *Foundations for Kids* is written for 52 weeks of Bible study, 5 days per week. Your meeting could be set up to review what kids have read the week before or to preview what they will read on their own in the week ahead.

Remember that the focus of the Foundations curriculum goes through the H.E.A.R. model. The acronym H.E.A.R. stands for Highlight, Explain, Apply, and Respond. Each of these four steps contributes to creating an atmosphere to hear God speak. Notice that all of the words in the H.E.A.R. formula are action words: Highlight, Explain, Apply, and Respond. Structure each meeting to go through the H.E.A.R. formula.



Each week, there will be 5 passages for Younger Kids to read and 5 passages for Older Kids to read, plus a memory verse for the week. The passages always overlap and are written to the same Bible truth. Each week your meeting should ...

- **READ THE BIBLE PASSAGES.** God speaks through the Bible, when you pray, and through fellowship with others all ways your child can hear God speak as you go through *Foundations for Kids*.
- **MEMORIZE THE WEEKLY VERSE.** Play a variety of Bible memory games where you write each word of the verse on a card, and the kids put the verse in order. You can hide cards throughout the room, run a relay race to put the cards together, make them into a puzzle, or turn over a card each time the kids say the verse.



#### EXPLAIN

Each day, Explain will have 4 bullets summarizing what happened in the verse and what the verse means. Explain each passage as you read it so kids can review what happened and make connections to their experience. Always make time for kids to ask questions.



Every day, kids will have a learning activity to help them apply the Bible truth. This will make learning active and fun to complete these together as a group.



Give kids a few moments to respond in personal prayer, journal, or pray together as a group. Encourage kids to remember that prayer is part of a conversation with God.

#### **GENERAL TIPS**

- 1. Open every session by modeling how kids can pray before they have a quiet time with God. Pray and ask God to be with your time together and to speak to you.
- 2. Treat the Bible with respect and affirm its trustworthiness, authority, and reliability.
- 3. Ask kids what they think the passage means. Read together through Explain but be open to what each child is learning and how God speaks to the kids in your group.
- 4. Affirm that God loves and wants to have a relationship with each child.
- 5. Encourage kids any time they are able to complete their reading assignments outside of your time together.


